General Information

Eligibility

All competitors must be at least 21 years of age as of the close of entries and either: 1) a member in good standing of a club having membership in U.S. Figure Skating; 2) an individual member of U.S. Figure Skating; or 3) a member of a national figure skating association that is a member of the ISU. Entries from members of clubs with a probationary status will be accepted provided the entry is accompanied by a signed certification by the skater that he or she is properly qualified to participate in the event(s) entered. Skaters may compete in as many disciplines as qualified by age and test level, but may compete in only one event per discipline. Competitors may enter both couples and solo dance events. Age and test qualifications as of September 27, 2008 (close of entries), will determine classification. All skaters must skate at or one level above their highest test level.

Entries

Entries must be postmarked by **September 27, 2008**. Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Competition Committee and will require a \$50.00 late fee. NO REFUNDS WILL BE GRANTED UNLESS THE COMMITTEE CANCELS AN EVENT.

Schedule

Skaters should include a self-addressed stamped envelope with their application to receive a tentative schedule of events. An official schedule will be available at the Registration Desk. The tentative schedule will be posted as soon as available on the Club's website: www.iceworkssc.org. The tentative schedule is subject to change.

Age Categories

The following age categories apply to all events (unless otherwise specified):

Class I	21 to 30 years
Class II	31 to 40 years
Class III	41 to 50 years
Class IV	51 to 60 years
Class V	61 years & over

Age categories may be divided or combined depending on the number of entries. There must be two (2) or more entries to hold an event. Proof of age (driver's license, passport or other photo ID) may be required.

Music

All music must be turned into the Registration Desk at least one hour prior to the event. Music must be clearly marked with the skater's name and event. Only CDs will be accepted. CD-RW formats will not be accepted. CDs must have only one track per disk. Skaters must have a backup CD available for each event entered. All music must be picked up by the end of the competition. IceWorks Skating Club will not be responsible for holding or returning leftover CDs or cases.

Registration Desk

The Registration Desk will be open at least one hour prior to all scheduled events.

Rink

All events will be held at the IceWorks Skating Complex, an arena featuring four ice surfaces one measuring 100'x200' and three measuring 85'x200'. The complex also has two cafés locker rooms and pro shop, and is located 15 minutes from Wilmington, Delaware and 20 minutes from the Philadelphia International Airport.

Awards

Medals will be presented to the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th place finishers in each event.

Practice Ice

Practice ice will be available throughout the competition. Practice ice sessions will be offered at a cost of \$10.00 per 20-minute session. A schedule will be determined after the close of entries (September 27, 2008). A sign-up form will be mailed to all registrants who include a self-addressed, stamped envelope with their completed application. The official practice ice schedule and sign-up information will also be posted on the IceWorks Skating Club website www.iceworkssc.org, and will be available at the Registration Desk. Reservations will be handled on a first come, first serve basis.

Judging System

The 6.0 judging system will be used for all events. The U.S. Figure Skating well-balanced program requirements will be observed for each category of singles, pairs and dance events. Please see the U.S. Figure Skating 2008-2009 rulebook or website www.usfigureskating.org for more information on the requirements.

Compulsory Moves Events

Compulsory Moves will be performed without music and in any order with connecting steps necessary to link the various moves together. Mandatory deductions will be taken for unlisted or additional elements such as jumps, spins, repetitions or unsuccessfully executed moves. Skaters must skate at or one level above their highest FS Test.

Spin Events

Spins must be skated exactly as stated, but may be skated in any order. Connecting steps may be used, but will not affect scoring. All spin events are skated without music on half ice surface. Skaters must skate at or one level above their highest FS Test.

Interpretive Skating Events

The Interpretive Skating Events consist of a variety of skating moves and elements designed to enhance the skater's own interpretation of the music. Axels and double jumps are not permitted. Costumes that enhance the performance by appropriately reflecting the character of the music and theme will be considered in the judging. Props on the ice surface are not permitted; hand held props may be used. No "special effects" such as water, fire, pyrotechnics, dry ice, smoke or loud noises are permitted. Costumes that contain particles that may mar or leave anything on the ice surface are considered unsafe and will not be allowed. This includes feathers, boas, and excessive beading.

In all Interpretive Events, vocal music is permitted and age categories will be the same as for Free Skating events. Skaters will be judged on their ability to interpret the music and develop a theme by using their skating skills.

In the event less than two entries are received in a single category, the following categories may be combined. Vocal music is permitted. Rhythms are to be the same as the annual selection by the ISU. Maximum time 2:40.

Solo Dance Events

Competitors in the Solo Dance events may compete at the test level that he or she has partially tested, completed, or one level higher than he or she has completed. Male and female skaters may be combined in this event.

Improvisational Skating

Male and female skaters may be combined for this event. Skaters will spontaneously create a program using music chosen by the Competition Committee. Skaters may skate at or one level above their current Free Skating Test.

The event will be conducted as follows:

- a) Music will be selected by the Committee and may include more than one piece.
- b) Music will be played twice during on-ice warm-up.
- c) Skaters will return to the locker room after warm-up and remain there while waiting for their turn to skate.
- d) No coaches or other assistants are allowed in the locker room or at the boards at any time.
- e) No double jumps allowed.
- f) Competitors will be judged according to: (1) Choreography; (2) Originality; and (3) Showmanship.

Maneuver Teams

Each skater may enter only one Maneuver Team event. Teams will consist of at least 3 skaters and no more than 5 skaters at the prescribed test level. No skater may perform more than two elements. Skaters on a team do not have to represent the same club. Each team should submit one team application form with the team's entry fee. Each team should construct a sign or poster that shows their team's name.

^{*} Spiral Sequence - A sequence of steps which incorporates various spirals in a pattern across the ice. Spirals in a spiral sequence may be done going forward, backwards, in a straight line or on a curve, on an inside or an outside edge.
